### We've been doing it for a while...

- · 1924
  - Established first wildlife refuge "Kimball" (28 acres) in Charlestown RI
- **1928** 
  - Parker Woodland donated (240 acres) in Coventry, RI

## Today



- 93 parcels of land in 30 communities
- Protect 9,300 acres
  - 6,800 acres
    - Fee Ownership
  - 2,500 acres
    - Conservation Easement
