



 Majority not serving original purpose





There are 671 regulated dams in Rhode Island




97 High Hazard


83 Significant Hazard









Most dams in RI are privately owned, but almost one quarter have no category and more have either wrong or no ownership information






More than 150 dams have questionable ownership...

97 dams are listed as High Hazard, 43 of which are in poor/fair condition







Are These Dams Safe?

- Very few dams are inspected on an annual basis.
- Most of those are high hazard dams known to be in poor condition.
- Inspections are visual and do not include an engineering analysis.
- Not much is known about the condition of significant and low hazard dams.

Whittenton Pond Dam, Taunton MA



- Significant Hazard
- Poor condition
- October 2005 high rains caused 2,000 people to be evacuated



Forge Pond Dam, Freetown MA

High rains the week of Feb.
22nd caused dam to breach endangering downstream homes, dam and bridges





- A dozen homes evacuated
- Traffic rerouted at downstream bridges

Dam Safety

- Dams can be a liability
- Owners need to understand responsibilities
- Infrastructure that needs maintenance







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Officials still fear dam collapse

Break in Massachusetts could leave town under 8 feet of water

TAUNTON, Massachusetts (CNN) -- Water pouring through a 173-year-old wooden dam protecting Taunton has placed increasing strain on the structure, and officials said Tuesday they fear it could collapse.

"If the dam were to break ... we will see rising floodwaters in downtown Taunton," Mayor Robert Nunes told reporters. "We are monitoring the situation minute-by-minute."

Expensive

- Maintenance costs
- Inspection costs
- Repair costs
- Repeated repairs

Recommendations for Rhode Island

- Rivers are ecological systems

- Dams should be inspected by dam owners
- Projects need to be less cost prohibitive
- Streamlined permitting process
- Sediment standards
- Incentives for dam owners
