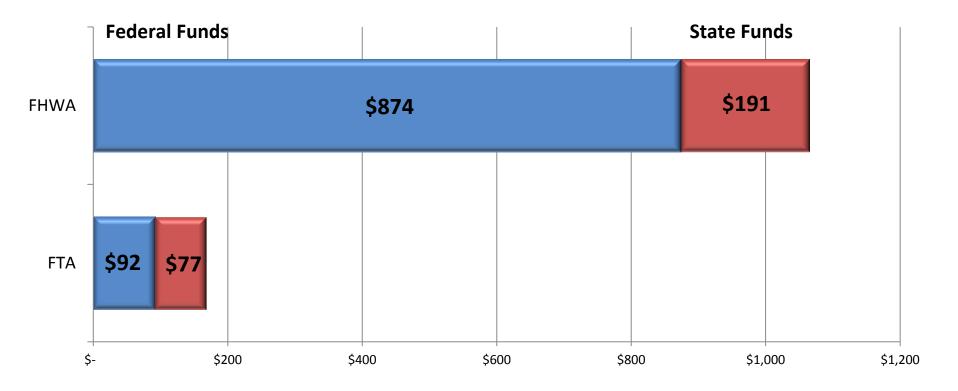

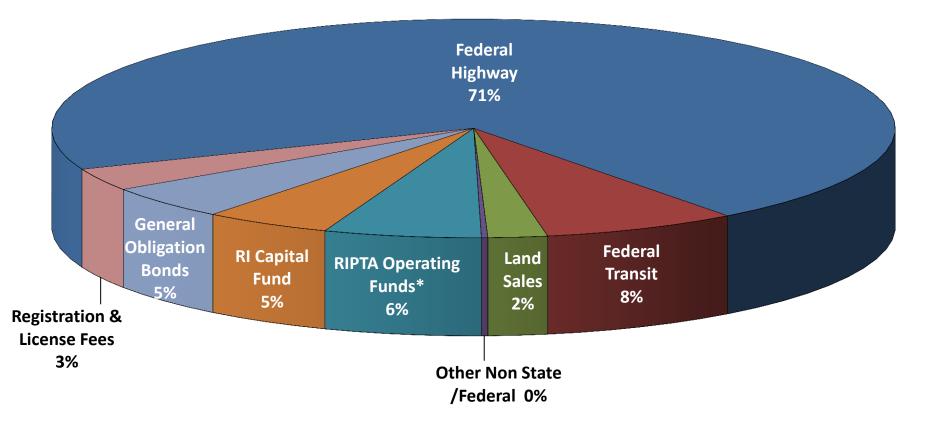

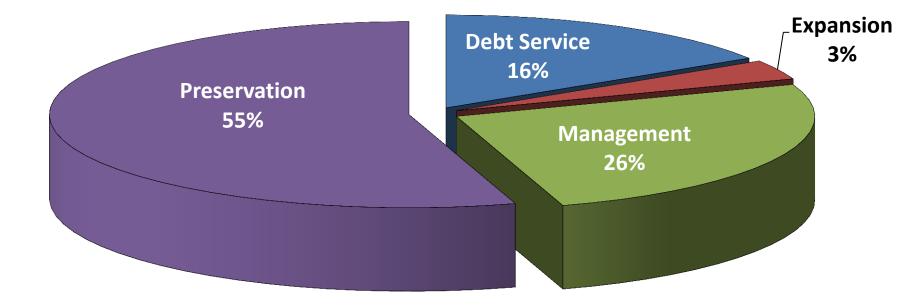
FFY 2013-2016 FHWA Program by Category



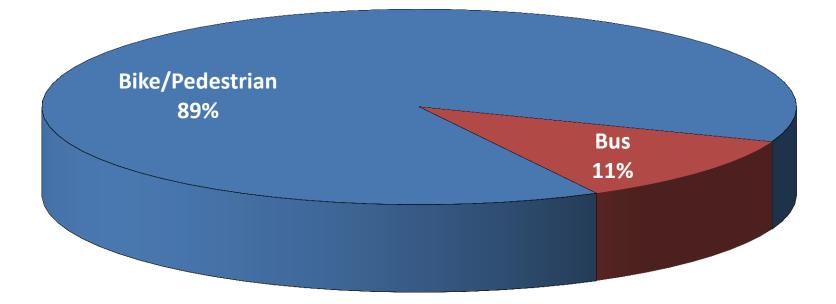
FFY 2013-2016 Funding Allocation by Mode
